Call for Application - Visiting Professor

Position: Visiting Professor – Graduate Program in International Relations, Federal University of Bahia (PPGRI/UFBA), Brazil

Description: The Graduate Program in International Relations of the Federal University of Bahia, Brazil, seeks to find competitive candidates for a position as Visiting Professor. The call is for one year and is renewable for up to one additional year for Brazilian professors, and up to three additional years for foreign professors. Activities are planned to begin on **August 01, 2026**, but this date can be negotiated.

We are particularly interested in candidates who can widen and deepen our strengths in one or more of the following research areas: critical theories of International Relations, critical race theory in International Relations, queer and gender theories in International Relations, and critical theories of global capitalism.

The successful candidate(s) is(are) expected to teach, in Portuguese, up to two graduate courses per semester; to supervise or co-supervise graduate research projects; to collaborate with the ongoing research projects of at least one of the faculty members; to take part in committees related to the academic and strategic planning activities of the Program; and to contribute to the building of international research networks and/or projects involving at least one of the faculty members. Salaries are competitive.

Please note that this is part of a general call of the Federal University of Bahia, Brazil. Candidates must be aware of the documents, criteria, requisites, and timeframe specified in the general call. The Graduate Program in International Relations is responsible for pre-selecting names, which will then be evaluated by a university committee assigned for that purpose. This committee will make the final selection. The pre-selection by the Program is not a guarantee that the candidate will be selected by the University.

The application process requires the following documents to be sent in PDF format to ppgri@ufba.br:

- Letter of application (up to 2 pages);
- Letter(s) of support from one (or more) of the faculty members of the Graduate Program in International Relations, confirming that the candidate's work plan



- is in line with intellectual and/or research projects currently developed or planned by this or these member(s);
- the *curriculum vitae*;
 - Work plan, with a maximum of 10 pages, detailing the academic and scientific activities to be carried out during the contract period – such as teaching (including the disciplines the candidate would be willing to teach), supervision, research, and technical and bibliographic production – explicitly stating the planned schedule and the expected products/results derived from the selected professor's work within the Graduate Program in International Relations. The plan should not be merely a research project, as this is only one of the activities expected from the candidates to develop during the contract. The work plan must be signed and initialed by the candidate; and
 - Doctoral diploma.

The deadline for the application is **January 15, 2025**. After the analysis of the documents by the Graduate Program in International Relations, if the selection committee considers necessary, online interviews with the pre-selected candidates can be scheduled to the period between **January 26 and January 30, 2026**. Candidates will be informed of the pre-selection outcome before **March 1, 2026**.
